



DEPARTMENTUPDATES

A behind the scenes look at what our departments have been working on over the past 30 days.

ACADEMICS

The Department of Academics has been providing targeted professional development for all K-12 staff, focusing on continuing our ELA and Math curriculum K-5 and content curriculum 6-12. We have rolled out our new Science curriculum 6-8, embedding Gizmos into our work, and our new Social Studies curriculum 6-8. We are excited to receive information from the CSDE regarding the new Science of Reading resources and dive into the work in order to choose the best resource for our students. Lastly, we successfully launched FUNdations in Grade 3 and continue to provide support.

FINANCE

The Finance Department is in the final stages of implementation to convert to a paperless process and move to an electronic filing system. Doing so will significantly improve the efficiency of the department. The department is also undergoing a review of all of its processes to ensure that the public's money is well cared for. As part of this review process, all employees are encouraged to provide input on what they believe is working well and what can improve.

CHIEF OF STAFF

The Board of Education continues to work collaboratively with its collective bargaining groups. After a long period of negotiations, both the Board and the Union approved the ratified Local 2407 Paraeducator contract, which is active from July 1, 2022 through June 30, 2025. Thank you to all staff members who dedicate significant time to the negotiation process.



PERSONNEL AND TALENT

The Personnel and Talent Development Department partnered with fitness industry experts and Nationally accredited trainers from YWCA New Britain to launch an online wellness platform. The platform offers wellness resources, both pre-recorded and live fitness classes, self-care opportunities, and meaningful trauma-informed practices. The CSDNB Wellness Academy began on Tuesday, September 6, with a 4-week 'Jumpstart to Wellness' series on a curated platform called 'Thinkific.' Jumpstart to wellness includes Fitness, Nutrition, Mindfulness, and Fiscal Health.

The department has been working extremely hard in the face of a nationwide labor shortage. Approximately 200 new staff members from various classifications have been hired since June 1.

Our Recruitment and Placement Specialists (RPS) have been diligently vetting and "cold calling" applicants to assist with identifying potential teacher candidates. RPS have met with several school-based administrative teams to review staffing needs and to visit our Teacher Residents.

We continue to work to recruit paraeducators. On Saturday, September 24, the department hosted CSDNB Para Fair, a paraeducator recruitment fair. ()

FACILITIES

Enhanced Cleaning Techniques and Training - Proves Great Results: Newly offered custodial cleaning training has been yielding many compliments from building administrators and occupants throughout the district. These new cleaning techniques have been developed and implemented after many hours of observation and training throughout the district.

Beautification of Grounds with a focus on Safety Prevention: As a department, we have been focused on ensuring our grounds are well kept and are not posing any security or safety issues. This work includes the removal of over-developed brush in many areas, dead trees, fence repairs, and concrete or asphalt repairs. We will continue this work throughout the district into October.

PUPIL SERVICES

Shout out to Brookside students and staff members! They have seen a 30% increase in attendance over the same time period last school. Brookside faculty conducted a team meeting where they discussed data around restraints and seclusions and attendance. The teams utilized the Doug Reeves Leadership Matrix to pinpoint intentional structures that speak to any positive gains in the data points versus just being "Lucky" for achieving those gains.





CLIMB Students serve coffee and breakfast items from the CLIMB Cafe at City Hall.






TECHNOLOGY


Our classrooms have been buzzing with the new projectors! A lengthy project to replace the audio visual hardware at the schools is coming near its completion. With Slade Middle School as the last major school in the project, the district is nearing the completion of upgrades to over 700 locations. Support videos are under development to provide assistance on the features that come with the new technology. O

Student Devices for our newest learners have been delivered to the schools, with nearly 800 devices delivered over the past few weeks. Student device insurance is available for purchase through our MySchoolBucks Store, connected in the PowerSchool Parent Portal. Insurance Purchases are coming in daily, and we are outpacing our device insurance enrollments from last year. It's the most affordable way to protect your student device.

AN UPDATE FROM THE **Superintendent**

We are off to a great start to the school year. This would not have been possible without lots of collaboration between our staff, families, and the City of New Britain. We know that there have been some late bus runs and a few other glitches, but our dedicated staff is aware of these issues and constantly work to make improvements. I have attended a number of evening events, and I'm so glad to see our schools and families being engaged together!

For reasons of privacy, I can't tell you many details, but I'd like to share with you that the district is making security upgrades throughout the district. We're strongly improving our use of technology to strengthen school security across the district. In addition to this work, we will be using some of our remaining federal recovery funds to hire an outside specialist in school security that will deliver a private report to the Board of Education and me later this school year. This report will inform future, ongoing security improvements. As we get closer to the winter months, we know that we will have snow days, delays, and early dismissals. It is incredibly important that families ensure that their school(s) have accurate email addresses and phone numbers for them. Please contact your school's main office to update your contact information. Our ConnectEd phone calls and emails will always be your quickest and most reliable way to hear from your school. We also post this information to television channels, but these are not as reliable or as detailed.

On the topic of school security, we have all seen the need for schools near and far to enter into lockdowns or shelterin-place. Please know that whenever we see the need to do so, your school's principal and staff will be busy dealing with important tasks. Our first priority will be to keep children calm and safe. When the emergency is lifted, your school principal/administrator will communicate with you via a phone call or email, but this is not possible during the emergency. We know that parents want to know exactly what is happening at every moment, but this is not possible while the staff is ensuring a calm and safe environment in these instances. Thank you for your understanding.


